The preface to the Ten Commandments is contained in these words, I am the LORD thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.¹ Wherein God manifesteth his sovereignty, as being JEHOVAH, the eternal, immutable, and almighty God;² having his being in and of himself,³ and giving being to all his words⁴ and works:⁵ and that he is a God in covenant, as with Israel of old, so with all his people;6 who, as he brought them out of their bondage in Egypt, so he delivereth us from our spiritual thraldom;7 and that therefore we are bound to take him for our God alone, and to keep all his commandments.8
